For our first major concert in 2023 and with the disruption of Covid behind us, we bring you Handel Messiah, probably the most popular of all oratorios.

Rendered musically in moving arias and rousing choruses, the oratorio foretells of His coming and His birth, through His life experiences such as His rejection and suffering, to His Death and beyond, as well as His influence on our own lives.

Ruth Jenkins-Róbertsson *Soprano* is from Newcastle, studied opera at the Royal Academy of Music, and is a Samling Artist. Operatic highlights include appearances in Don Giovanni for Scottish Opera and The Magic Flute with New Zealand Opera.

Concert highlights include Orff Carmina Burana, Mozart Requiem with John Rutter and as the soprano soloist in McCarthy Codebreaker in the combined Newcastle Choral Society and Hertfordshire Chorus concert at Sage Gateshead in May 2022





Austin Gunn *Tenor* has appeared as a professional tenor in many operatic roles for companies such as English National Opera, Edinburgh International Festival, and Scottish Opera, as well as oratorios and recitals in Europe and the UK.


Austin became Professor of Singing at Trinity Laban Conservatoire in 2021. He also teaches singing from his home in Tyneside.



Ben Noble *Baritone* is from north-east England, studying with Graeme Danby. Ben has performed many operatic roles in the UK and recently appeared in La Boheme as his debut in France. Concert engagements include Bach St John Passion and Mozart Reauiem.

Ben works for the National Youth Choirs of Great Britain, and conducts the Military Wives Choir at Catterick Garrison.

Elizabeth Hogarth *Alto*, also known as Singer of the Lakes, is from Kendal. Specialising equally in classical music, operatic arias and musical theatre; career highlights have included singing at such venues as the Royal Albert Hall and the Walt Disney Symphony Hall in Los Angeles.
